



Dear Parent/Guardian:

Our records indicate that your child has a potentially severe allergy that may require treatment at school. Attached to this letter are the forms that will give us the necessary information and authorization to treat your child in the event of an emergency.

An allergy action plan should be on file at the school for every student with a severe allergy. It must be updated and signed by your medical provider every year and provided to the school. If you have documentation other than the Melissa ISD action plan, please provide it to your campus nurse and inquire about what other information and forms your nurse may need in order to care for your child appropriately.

It is important for your child's safety that we have the proper authorizations and supplies in the nurse clinic in order to respond to an emergency. Your child's supplies should include an antihistamine and an epinephrine auto-injector, if your child's plan calls for it. Please be alert to the expiration dates on the medications.

If we do not have these forms and supplies on hand and your child has a serious reaction, we may need to call 911 to assure your child's safety.

All completed forms need to be returned to the school nurse on your child's campus. We appreciate your help in our effort to provide the best care for your child.
